The green economy is an emerging and aspirational sector for Collingwood, and one where the Town and community partners have made significant strides by putting a “green lens” on local decision making.

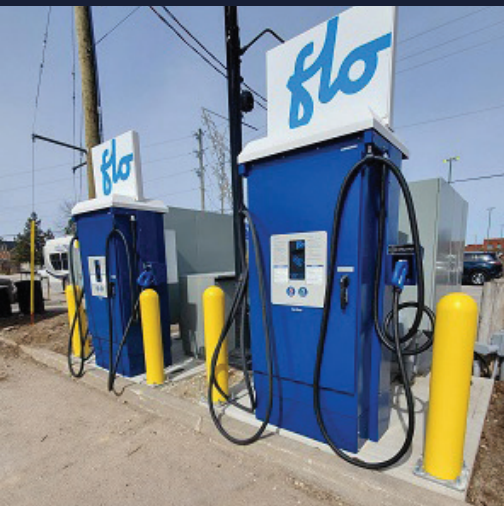
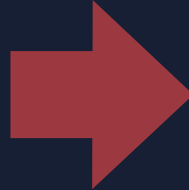
Job counts show tangible growth within the sector. Where there were three businesses in 2012 within the sector, in 2021 there were nine, two of which had more than 10 employees. Having six new self-employed businesses is also a sign of considerable growth locally.

Collingwood 'Smart' Stormwater Project

Led by GREENLAND® Consulting Engineers, a consortium of technology companies delivered the first Canadian collaboration to mitigate problems of climate-change induced stormwater flooding. The three year project was funded by the Federation of Canadian Municipalities and included the construction and monitoring of Low Impact Development (LID) practices. Together with the engagement of property owners, 'smart' water-grid technologies provided 'big-data' insights to better quantify municipal flooding risks and identify cost-effective solutions.

UN Habitat World Summit

The Town of Collingwood in collaboration with the Urban Economy Forum and UN-Habitat hosted the Habitat in Towns – Collingwood World Summit for 3 consecutive years. The Summits lead the discussion on the role of towns and small cities in achieving Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), in particular, SDG 11: sustainable, resilient, safe, and inclusive communities and cities. The **first Collingwood World Summit** was held in September 2020, in conjunction with the 75th anniversary of the United Nations the **second Collingwood World Summit** was held in October 2021. in conjunction with World Habitat Day and the **third Collingwood World Summit** was held in October/November 2022 with a focus on understanding how “sustainable housing and finance” can be a catalyst for achieving the SDGs at the scale of towns and small cities.

Canopy Bees + Trees Project

Canopy Collingwood is a community green project aimed at increasing the Town's urban tree canopy and pollinator habitat on private lands. The program has grown to include residential pollinator gardens that increase pollinator habitats and access to food. Collingwood residents are provided a financial incentive in the form of a rebate on the purchase of up to two trees from a recognized nursery or garden centre operation, or the materials required to establish a pollinator garden on private property.
